What is WANIC?

WANIC is the Washington Network for Innovative Careers. The WANIC Skill Center offers high quality tuition-free technical and professional training for high school Juniors and Seniors. These yearlong, advanced-level Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs are based on rigorous academic and industry standards to prepare students for career and college readiness. WANIC programs offer dual credit opportunities (both high school and college credit) and/or lead to industry certifications. cont.

Programs are designed in three-period blocks allowing extended time to not only learn the theory of a subject but also get authentic handson lab experience. All classes earn Occupation Education high school credits and may offer other course equivalencies toward high school graduation requirements. Online registration will open on February 2, 2021. New Year's Resolutions

Setting New Year's resolutions is an exciting and optimistic way of looking ahead to the next 12 months - the year feels squeaky clean and filled with possibilities. You've read this advice before: Start small, choose measurable goals, and write them down. The common practice is to set these goals at the beginning of January, but why can't we make resolutions all year long?

Not surprising given the current situation, for the month of January, we would like to share ideas on setting goals in the Mental Health/Changing your perspective category. The Circle of Influence/Circle of Concern is a concept described by Stephen Covey in *The 7 Habits of Highly Effective People*. The Circle of Influence refers to the things in our lives over which we have control (how we raise our children, what we eat, our attitude and beliefs, habits, behavior, and what we post on social, etc.). The Circle of Concern consists of all the things that are out of our control (what other people think about us, the weather, political views of our neighbors, etc.). Here is a Resolutions Template you can use to describe your goals and their specific details. Please continue reading to learn about some New Year's resolutions centered on expanding our Circle of Influence and shrinking our Circle of Concern, second semester, financial aid, and Running Start.

We are Juanita High School Earth Corps, and we are concerned about the amount of single-use

plastic that we use in our daily lives, especially the plastics that end up in the environment. In 2019, plastic alone accounted for 14.0% of King County's total waste disposed of (2019 King County Waste Characterization Report). This metric does not include the plastic that is carelessly dumped into our public spaces, much of which is single-use plastic that ends up in our waterways. The World Economic Forum predicts that by 2050, plastic will outweigh continue reading...

The JHS Earth Corps team created plastic trash art to emphasize that there is **TOO MUCH** plastic in our oceans. They ask that your New Year's Resolution includes durable alternatives to single-use plastics: **reusable** water bottles, bags, straws, cups....and masks too!
